A place to grow

It's spring! Welcome returning and new garden members. The snow is almost entirely gone from the corners of the garden, the new shed is in place, and work commences on the Phase 2 build out of the remaining garden beds very soon. The wait list is empty with all applicants now officially garden members. A few beds are still available!



Key Garden Dates and Topics

- Member Volunteer Day Join us on Saturday, April 29 from 9:00 11:00 a.m. to finish
 preparations for the season. Time spent working on this day counts towards your six hours of
 required "Work Day" time to support the garden.
- Existing Gardener Garden Access If you had a bed last year, please start gardening on Saturday, April 29. This is a couple days ahead of the originally planned start day to let you leverage the weekend. Help yourself to two buckets of compost to refresh your soil. The entry code remains the same.
- Opening Day Join us on Saturday, May 13 from x-x for the official opening day celebration.
 Purchase seedlings from xxx and Portsmouth Community Garden t-shirts, stickers, and more. New gardeners learn which bed is theirs and the entry code.
- Work Day Sign Ups Each garden bed requires three Work Day shifts (six total hours) of community work. This year, it is easier than ever to select your hours. Note the following: 1) visit the website and click on the Sign Up Genius link, 2) sign up via the link when Volunteer Coordinator, Jenn Cotrupi, sends you an email reminder, or 3) check out the white board in the shed to choose talks and report your hours. Work Day efforts keep the garden ship shape for all!



Corporate Earth Day – Build Out Day

Throughout the day on **Friday, April 21** (rain date April 28) two local corporations, Lonza Biologics and Service Credit Union will supply 20+ volunteers for the morning and afternoon shifts to complete the garden bed build out and start to fill the beds with loam and spread woodchips to serve as a weed barrier.

Successful All Hands Meeting and Seedling Seminar

Will Lowenthal, Master Gardener – UNH Cooperative Extension and head of the Derry Community Garden, reminded all in attendance that spring is right around the corner.
